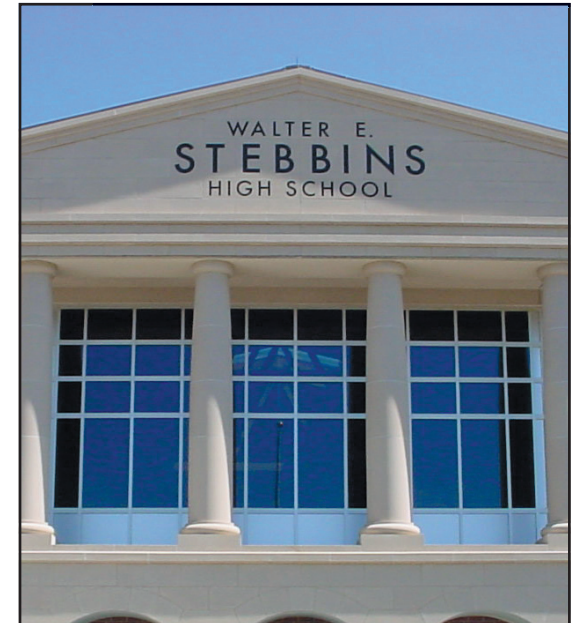
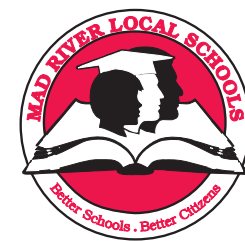

Senior Year Course Overview

Your **Senior year** will introduce you to advanced medical terminology as well as human anatomy and physiology. During this year you will be presented with advanced pathologies and diagnostic tools for our body systems. In your Senior year, you will also be educated on obstetrics and child health as well as oncology, pharmacology and mental health. Senior students also participate in the Quickstart program through Sinclair for a quarter of college psychology. Students will continue to assist the district nurses with health screening of Mad River students as well as the community blood drive at Stebbins High School.

Minimum Academic Requirements for Admission into the Allied Health Tech Prep Program

- Algebra I or equivalent — grade of “C” or better
- Biology — grade of “C” or better
- 2.0 Minimum GPA
- Be in good academic standing towards graduation

Junior Year Course Overview

The **Junior year** in the Allied Health Program introduces you to the fundamentals of medical terminology and human anatomy. You will gain an in-depth understanding of office procedures, billing and coding information as well as documentation used in health care. In addition, you will learn about how health care started as well as different legal and medical ethics, HIPAA and other legislative issues. During this year you will become certified in CPR and first aid and learn OSHA requirements. You will be trained in many basic hands on activities such as taking vital signs, blood pressure, & pulse checks, and assist with hearing and vision screenings to students in the Mad River School district.

Allied Health Tech Prep Program

Allied Health is a Tech Prep program. It is a seamless career-technical education program that begins in your junior year of high school and continues through an associate degree in college and beyond. You will be awarded a Tech Prep Scholarship in the amount of \$3,000 by successfully completing the Allied Health Tech Prep program and earn college credit hours. The Allied Health Tech Prep program emphasizes teamwork, hands-on learning, work-site experiences, critical thinking, and problem solving.
