

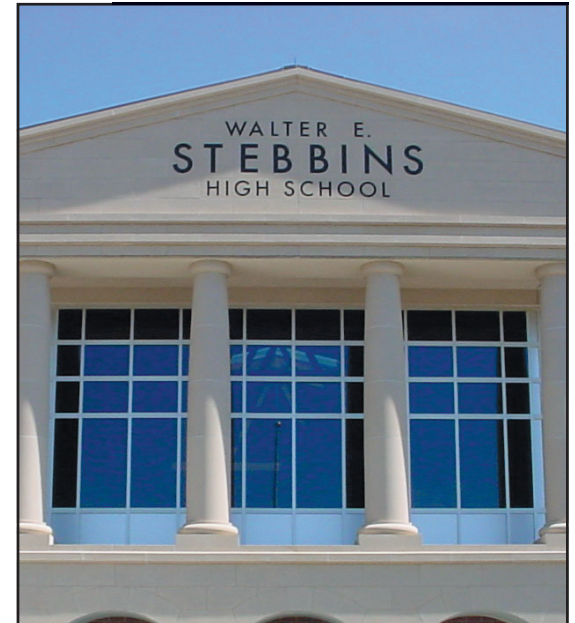

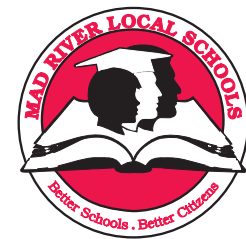

Senior Year Overview

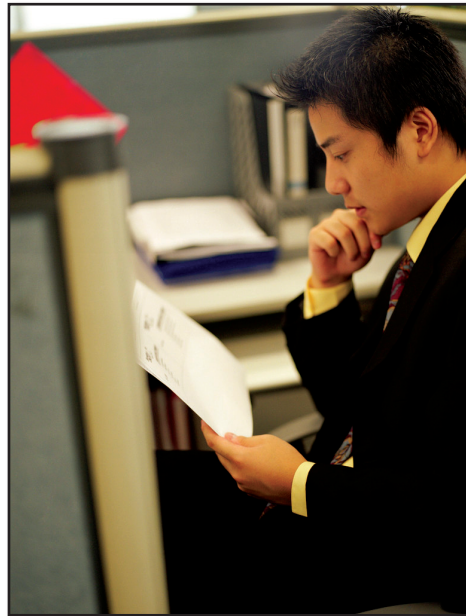
The **Senior Year** starts out with a focus on Entrepreneurship. You will identify factors of being an entrepreneur and discuss key elements of business and financial planning. You will also learn Human Resource Management. You will learn the basic resource management concepts and learn how to manage employees.

Junior Year Overview

The **Junior Year** in Business Management class is all about learning the basics. You will learn the history and functions of Business Management and explore careers in the field. During the 2nd semester you will be asked to run your own business. You will be the manager of 1 of the 16 businesses in the model community. Some components of the business simulation include banking, communication, payroll, accounts payable and receivable, shipping and mailing, advertising, and investing.

Tech Prep Partnership & Post-Secondary Education

A college education is critical for future success in business. The management program at Stebbins High School provides a unique opportunity to begin working towards a Bachelor's degree in business through what is known as a 2 + 2 + 2 pathway. With successful completion of the two year high school program, students are awarded a \$3,000 scholarship for enrollment into a business concentration at Sinclair Community College. In addition, students are eligible to receive college credit for Sinclair. After two years students would transfer credits to a four year university where they will complete the requirements for a Bachelor's degree. Students may choose to forego the scholarship.
