Car Riders & Parent/Guest Traffic



Parents driving children to school will enter the second drive into the school. You should drive in front of the building and turn around using the circle so that your passenger door is facing the school. Visitor parking is in front of the building. **PLEASE DRIVE SLOWLY!** The speed limit is 10 mph.

Walkers: Use cross walks and wait for crossing guard. Kindergarten parents should walk students to school and watch as they walk in the front door.

Student Assessment



On August 16th all kindergarten students are scheduled for a kindergarten assessment. This appointment will last one hour.

While students are being assessed, parents will attend an orientation and complete important school forms. It is very important that all parents and children keep their appointment time.

Classroom Supply Fees:



Kindergarten fees are \$30. These fees help provide classroom supplies, including workbooks and expendable items and subscriptions such as Weekly Reader.

Fees may be paid at the Kindergarten Assessment, Aug. 16 or by sending payment with your child or by stopping by the office.

Fees should be paid the first week of school unless a fee schedule or waiver of fees has been applied for through the principal's office. Students may not participate in special school events unless fees have been paid. No Report Cards or school records will be issued without payment of school fees.

Bus Cards will be mailed to students assigned to bus transportation.

Students shouldn't be at school before 7:55 unless they are in the BAS Program as there is no supervision until then.

Student Supplies:



Copies of supply lists are posted on Stevenson's front door and are available in the office and online. Questions you may have concerning supplies may be asked of your child's teacher at the Parent Orientation.

Open House

This is an important opportunity for parents and students to meet their child's teacher and learn about expectations for the school year. This is a crucial meeting and we hope you can attend.

Lunch:



A school lunch is \$1.85. Students may pay on a daily basis or parents deposit money in their lunch account at the administration building (next door to Stevenson) or at the Stevenson Office. Only two lunch charges are permitted per student per year. Forms for those applying for free or reduced lunch are available at Stevenson and at the administration building.

No pop is allowed in the cafeteria. Children bringing lunch from home should not bring any carbonated drinks. They may purchase milk for 50¢.

Breakfast:



Breakfast is provided FREE to any student who wishes to eat at school. The date breakfast will begin will be announced later. Students wishing to eat breakfast should arrive at school at 7:45a.m..

Dress Code: See the student handbook for information. Students need to wear **gym shoes** to school. No flip flops or open sandals are allowed. Shoes with heels should not be worn as children must be able to run and play in their shoes.



Medication: If your child needs to have medication dispensed by the office, **please come to the office to get the appropriate form.** Medicine can only be dispensed if a doctor's authorization is on file with us.

Before & After School Care

If you wish to register your child for the new Before and After School (BAS) program, please contact the office at 259-6630 as soon as possible to register. There is a \$10 non-refundable registration fee for each family. Fees are listed below. Each additional child in the family is 2/3 the fee for the first child.

Fees are as follows:

Before & After School (Extended Hours Up To 27.5 hours weekly) \$ 80.00 1st child; \$53.25 each additional child

After School hours Only (Up To 20 hours weekly 2:10 –6:00p.m.) \$ 60.00 1st child; \$40.00 each additional child

Morning Care Only (Up To 7.5 hours weekly (6:30-8:00a.m.) \$ 20.00 1st child; \$13.22 each additional child

Hours are 6:30-8:00a.m.; 2:10-6:00p.m.
