- Received information on the 22nd Annual Educational Purchasing Council (EPC) Annual Vendor Fair to be held on September 21, 2011 from 10:00 a.m. – 3:00 p.m. at the Hara Arena Conference and Exhibition Center.

- Heard an update on the progress toward the implementation of our Race to the Top (RttT) Year 2 Scope of Work.
- Heard a first reading for Board Policy #470: Employee Use of Social Media which describes the purpose, general statement of policy, gives definitions of public social media networks and district approved password-protected social media tools, district requirements, and suggested guidelines

to follow when using social networking sites and/or blogs for personal use.

- Heard a first reading for Board Policy #4162: CDL Drug and Alcohol Testing for Employees Who Work in a Safety Sensitive Position which is being adopted in order to comply with requirements of the Federal Omnibus Transportation Employees Testing Act of 1991, and applicable Federal regulations and to establish a Board alcohol and drug testing policy and program for certain Mad River Local Schools personnel.
- Received information from Mr. Speas that the 2011-2012 school year tuition rate is \$2,506.37.
- Reviewed a report from Mr. Speas reporting the approximate amount of money the Mad River Local School District expects to receive from federal grants for the 2011-2012 school year.
- Reviewed a report from Ms. Nicholas giving details of grades K-12 enrollment.
- Heard a report from Mr. Speas on open enrollment breakdown and a four-year history of student enrollment.
- Heard an overview of Race to the Top (RttT) from Ms. Nicholas on our progress toward implementation of scope of work for year two of the four-year grant. This is the roll-out process for the Common Core in English/Language Arts and Mathematics, as well as the Revised State Standards in Science and Social Studies. Other key activities of focus are training key personnel in the areas of the new Ohio Principal and Teacher Evaluations Systems, and keeping abreast of continued changes to Value-Added reports and requirements.
