Welcome to your new school at Stevenson Elementary! With all the planning and preparation we have done this summer, I know it is going to be a terrific year! I am looking forward to meeting all our new kindergarten students as they begin their school adventure.

First Day of School

Kindergarten students start school on a staggered schedule so that teachers have small numbers while they acquaint the children with the school and each other. The schedule is as follows:

- Tues., Sept. 5th—Only Kindergarten students with last names A-L attend school.
- Wed., Sept. 6th—Only Kindergarten students with last names M-Z attend school.
- Thurs., Sept. 7th—All Kindergarten students attend SChool.

Open House

The start of the school year is such a special time, filled with anticipation and hopes of what the new school year will bring. I am sure you have many questions about how your child's classroom will be run and what will be expected of your child. On Thurs., August 31, from 4:00 - 5:00 p.m., you will have the perfect opportunity to find answers to your questions and to begin a relationship with our kindergarten teachers and school.

Kindergarten Assessment

On *Tuesday*, *August 29th*, *from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.* student assessments have been scheduled. Your child's appointment will take approximately 1 ½ hours. Please check your day and time on the enclosed letter.

The Ohio Legislature requires that each child entering kindergarten take the state kindergarten assessment. This kindergarten readiness assessment is used as a tool to gather information about students' pre-reading skills as they enter kindergarten.

It is extremely important that your kindergarten child attend on their assigned day and time.

Every Stevenson student will demonstrate proficiency at or above grade level in writing by the end of the school year.




Parent Information and Support

Our staff is here to make sure that your child gets the best education that we can deliver and to keep them healthy. But we can't do it alone. Please help us in preparing your child for a great school year.

- Send you child to school every day, on time, ready to learn. (7:55-2:25)
- Provide a water bottle for them to use throughout the day.
- Continue to teach them good hygiene skills like washing their hands.
- Check their homework folder DAILY.
- Promise to help your child every night with homework and reading. Remember, this does not mean you do it for him or her.
- Read to or with your child every night, if only for ten to fifteen minutes.
- Communicate with your child's teacher, whether by Remind, phone, note or e-mail.

Car Riders



We understand that for kindergarten students, parents often wish to walk them into school on the first few days. For the safety of our students PARENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO WALK THEIR CHILD INTO THE SCHOOL. Staff will meet car riders at the front of the school and escort the students to the gym to meet their teacher.

Bus Information

The transportation department is arranging all bus schedules and determining rider eligibility for the upcoming school year. Below is directions on how to get your child's bus information. Questions concerning student bus transportation can be addressed by calling the transportation office at 937-237-4280.


How it works:

Go to madriverschools.org and click on the Transportation link. Click on Bus Route Finder and select Mad River Local School District. Type in street number and the street name and zip code. (Note it is not necessary to select a school or grade when you search.) Click the search button to get a list of bus routes associated with your address.

Please be advised that the bus stop times listed are approximate due to unforeseen traffic, weather, etc. Students are to be at the assigned stop at least 5 minutes before the posted times.

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Stevenson Elementary's Arrival and Dismissal Process



The map above represents the procedure for picking up and dropping students off at school. Any students walking to school will wait to cross the parking lot until the adult guard crosses them.

Any students arriving or departing school by car should come to the front of the building as indicated in the map. Drivers are asked to pull around the circle and stop in front of the building for pick-up and drop-off.

Parents are to wait in their cars for students at the end of the day. DO NOT GET OUT OF YOU CAR OR PARK ALONG THE BUILDING. Students will be lined up when they leave the building to wait for their parent to pull around. As soon as the driver pulls up to the door, the child(ren) will be called to get in the car. Then that driver will be waved on to pull away and the next car will pull up. This may take a little longer in the beginning as we get used to the process, however with practice time will improve. The important thing to remember is that this is for the safety of your child.

Students should not be at school before 7:40 a.m. as there is not supervision. Please do not drop students off prior to staff unloading students. We cannot have unsupervised students out in front of the building prior to the doors opening. Dismissal is at 2:25 p.m. Please be prompt if your student is a car rider.

If you have a change in the transportation arrangements for the day, that request must be made in writing. For example, if you child typically rides the bus and you'll be picking them up that day, please write a note and send it to your child's teacher.

We are excited about the start of a new school year! Please take note of the following:

- All Back to School forms on OneView need to be completed ASAP. (Kindergarten parents should have already
 completed this during the online registration process.) Your student will not be able to participate in school
 functions and activities like field trips until they are completed. https://madriver.esvportal.com/
- In order to qualify for a free or reduced lunch, you must fill out the lunch application. The application can be submitted on line (link provided) or can be turned in to the school. The cost of a school lunch is \$2.25. Breakfast will continue to be provided free of charge to all students. https://www.lunchapplication.com/
- Elementary Student Fees for the 2023-2024 school year will be \$30. You have the option of paying school fees in person or online. We can only take cash, check, or money orders if paid in person.
